MLA, which sets style for papers written in the field of the arts and humanities, calls a long quote that consists of more than four lines of prose or three lines of verse just that: a long quotation. Omit quotation marks as you begin the quote on a new line, indenting it 1 inch from the left margin; you do not have to indent the right margin.

Block quotes are multiple sentences quoted directly from a source which take up more than 4 lines in your paper, or no more than 3 if you are quoting verse. Because these take up a lot of physical space, they should be used sparingly with a maximum of 1-2 for a complete paper.

The process for citing a quote which contains more than four lines of prose or text differs slightly from that of a shorter quote. If a passage has a middle section that doesn't relate to the point you are making, drop it out and replace it with an ellipsis (...) to indicate that you have left out part of the original text.

Block quotations may be called extracts, set-off quotations, long quotations, or display quotations. Block quotations are used in academic writing but are also common in journalistic and nonfiction writing. While block quotations are perfectly acceptable, it's important for writers to be selective about their use.

### How to Use Block Quotations in Writing

A typical quotation is part of a sentence within a paragraph in your paper; however, for longer quotations (more than five lines), format the excerpt as a block quotation. A block quotation begins on its own line, is not enclosed in quotation marks, and has its in-text citation after the final

punctuation.

Often, a block quotation is separated from the other part of the paper by beginning it on a new line and ensuring that it is indented from the left margin.
